So, we're deformed – now what?

As an adult, does your Christian faith exhort and inspire you to be **conformed**, **reformed**, or **transformed**?

No longer be **conformed** to this world, but be **transformed** by the **renewal of your mind**, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.

1 Corinthians 2:11-13

So conformed is old and transformed is new, but some of us are *reformed*. Doesn't that mean that God designed his church as a reform school or correctional facility to improve us and show us how to live better, nicer, more godly lives?

Not really. "Reformed" here applies primarily to doctrine.

What about being born again?

Catholics and Protestants agree that to be saved, you have to be born again. Jesus said so: "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God."

John 3:3

However, when **Catholics** say they've been "born again" they're referring to an inner transformation that God's grace supposedly accomplished in them when they were baptized. **Anglican** theology continues the Catholic view, as does **Reformed** when it says that "regeneration precedes faith."

For **Evangelicals**, the new birth precedes Biblical baptism in accordance with Romans 10:9, "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord', and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" and Acts 2:38, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

John Winthrop quoted Jesus from his Sermon on the Mount as the *Arbella* was about to embark on its 1630 voyage to establish a Puritan society in Massachusetts:

"You are the **light** of the world. **A city set on a hill** cannot be hidden. Nor do people **light** a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives **light** to all in the house. In the same way, **let your light shine** before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven."

Now we know that **the law is good**, if one uses it lawfully, understanding this, that the law is not laid down for the just but for the lawless and disobedient, for the ungodly and sinners, for the unholy and profane, for those who strike their fathers and mothers, for murderers, the sexually immoral, men who practice homosexuality, **enslavers**, liars, perjurers, and **whatever else*** is contrary to sound doctrine, **in accordance with the gospel of the glory of the blessed God** with which I have been entrusted.

BLM and "social justice"

"Wait a minute... don't all lives matter? I mean, what about mine, don't I matter? I have troubles, too."

"Well, yes, but we're talking about people who've been put down, marginalized, and discriminated against. You need to have been enslaved or oppressed for your life to count. We need to lift these victims up, and some of you need to be taken down a notch or two."

OK, but first let's look at Paul's list we just read about in 1 Timothy and consider "whatever else is contrary to sound doctrine" that might accompany the "enslavers" noted there...

Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin."

Who are the *enslavers*?

The term certainly includes all the **misguided people** who have kidnapped, bought, sold, and enslaved their fellow human beings over the millennia and right here in America. But speaking even more inclusively than that we need to add those captivated by:

The World – With all its captivating ideas, notions, practices, and teachings that are **contrary** to the sound doctrine of the Gospel.

The Flesh – With all its carnal desires, urges, and practices that are **contrary** to the sound doctrine of the Gospel.

The Devil – With all his deceptive enticements, thoughts, and rationalizations, every one of which is **contrary** to the sound doctrine of the Gospel.



All are both enslaved and enslavers

"Hurt people hurt people"

We have already charged that **all**, both Jews and Greeks, are under sin, as it is written: "None is righteous, no, not one... **all** have turned aside; together they have become worthless; no one does good, not even one..." For **all** have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.

Romans 3:9-12, 23

By our very nature every one of us has fallen short, gotten put down, and become not only oppressed but oppressors of others. And we keep on...

But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, to **redeem** those who were under the law, so that we might receive **adoption** as sons. Good News of a New King! We can be reborn into freedom!

- 1. Jesus is the King and Lord of the Universe who came to convict and free us of the burden of sin, give us eternal life, and raise our hearts up to him and those around us.
- **2. He calls us out of the world** [*ekklesia*], forgives us, cleanses us from the stain of sin, and presents us to his Father as spotless candidates for adoption into his family.
- **3.** He sends his Holy Spirit who fills our lives with faith, hope, and love, frees us to say "Yes" to righteousness and "No" to sin, and empowers us to lead godly lives in this world.
- **4. The Holy Spirit authorizes us to** let go of our unfulfilled expectations of others, **say "Yes" to being adopted** as children into the family of our Heavenly Father, and be raised up as spiritual brothers and sisters.

- 5. At home in the family of God we learn to accept, love, and walk in unity together, even as we speak the truth in love, become cleansed from our sin, and wash one another's feet.
- **6. We continue learning about God's Kingdom** authority, vision, and plans for us in his Kingdom and in the world so that we can work with and tell others about him.
- 7. He keeps surrounding us with and pouring his love into us, equipping and sending us out to make disciples of the nations as redeemed ambassadors and messengers of the Good News of the Kingdom of God.

What would Jesus do? His Keys to Success in this life:

What do we need to do?

"Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the Kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again."

John 3:5-7

How does a person get "born again"?

- Believe all religions teach the same thing.
- Go to church and always try to be a good person.
- **Enter** the Kingdom of God by *believing* in **Jesus**; *inviting* him into your heart as your Savior; *giving* your life to him as your Lord; and then *becoming* his disciple by *emptying* yourself and *taking* the form of a servant.

But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian, for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. Jesus and Nicodemus (Leader) "Rabbi, you are a teacher come from God."






Jesus and Caiaphas (Chief Priest) "It is expedient that one man should die."

Nicodemus in John 3 and 19

Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. This man came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him." Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God." Nicodemus said to him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God."

Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" Jesus answered him, "Are you the teacher of Israel and yet you do not understand these things?"


John 3:1-5, 9-10

Peter and Cornelius (Gentile)





Cornelius in Acts 10

At Caesarea there was a man named Cornelius, a centurion of what was known as the Italian Cohort, a devout man who feared God with all his household, gave alms generously to the people, and prayed continually to God. About the ninth hour of the day he saw clearly in a vision an angel of God come in and say to him, "Cornelius... your prayers and your alms have ascended as a memorial before God. And now send men to Joppa and bring one Simon who is called Peter..."

And Cornelius said, "So I sent for you at once, and you have been kind enough to come... So Peter opened his mouth and said: "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality... all the prophets bear witness [to Jesus] that **everyone who believes in him** receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

While Peter was still saying these things, *the Holy Spirit fell* on all who heard the word. And the believers from among the circumcised who had come with Peter were amazed, because *the gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out even on the Gentiles*. For they were hearing them *speaking in tongues and extolling God*. Then Peter declared, "Can anyone withhold water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?"

And he **commanded them to be baptized** in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked him to remain for some days.
